Fr. Peter Dugandzic's Thesis Public Defense

As many of you know, for a little more than two years Fr. Peter has lived in Rome working toward a doctorate in Moral Theology.

The most common question many asked during his brief visits to St. Mary's was how long he would take to finish and return home. Unfortunately, with regard to obtaining an advanced degree in Theology, the answer to that question tends to be vague in that the most that can be said is, "it will be finished when it is finished." When writing a dissertation, there is usually no timetable as the research and writing must be complete before a thesis can be scheduled for a public defense, which is the final step required to complete the degree.

Father Peter will publicly defend his thesis next Saturday, December 13th at 10:30 a.m. (NY time 4:30 a.m.) at the Academia Alfonsiana. The title of the dissertation is, *A Secular "Faith in Progress" and a Catholic Anthropology in the United States with Reference to Sexual Morality in the Writings of Paul Kurtz and Karol Wojtyla/John Paul II.*

Following the completion of his public defense, Father will return to Long Island in time for Christmas.

This week's question: What is Gaudate Sunday?

Answer to last week's question: What is the significance of the Advent wreath? The Advent wreath is a popular Advent tradition that had its beginning among pre-Christian Germanic people. They would use wreaths with lit candles during the dark winter nights as a sign of hope for the coming of spring. Christians adapted this custom as part of their preparation for Christmas. Catholics, Anglicans, Episcopalians and Lutherans all use Advent wreaths. Even though we have an Advent wreath at church, it is not really a part of our liturgy, but more of a domestic custom.

The circle of the wreath and the evergreens that are used are a symbol of eternal life. The four candles represent the four Sundays of Advent. Three candles are purple and one is rose. The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into

Gift of Compassion For Christmas

I myself will tend my sheep and have them lie down, declares the Sovereign LORD. I will search for the lost and bring back the strays. I will bind up the injured and strengthen the weak, but the sleek and the strong I will destroy. I will shepherd the flock with justice. Ezekiel 34: 16-17

During these trying times many question, “ How could our financial structure get so out of hand”? From Wall St. to Main Street, to the White House we are all puzzled, fraught with concern for the present and future. As we all know presents sometimes come wrapped in unattractive wrappings. Are these trying times a gift to make us all rethink how we run our lives and what is really important? This is definitely a time for all of us to look at how we can make this world a less frightful and gentler place.

How about during the Christmas Season giving each other the gift of compassion and making it a mainstay in your life? I know many times you feel your spouse, child, parent or friend “just don’t get it”. They don’t understand and respond to you with warmth, connectedness and relatedness that makes you feel understood. You at times wonder whom are they relating to? “ It not me”!!

There are people who are quite sensitive and appear to be born with a relatedness and compassion for others. While others appear to be locked in a vacuum where many times their past, genetics or lack of learning and experiences leave them without the sense of being able to express their compassion for others. To learn how to be compassionate is essential because relationships are most vital to help us deal, survive and thrive particularly in our troubling times.

Did you know that underlying our ability to be compassionate is how we regulate emotions? There is a field of study called “Emotional Regulation” that looks at what people do when they begin to feel positive or negative emotions. Some people move towards others while some move away. If you are one of those who move away the **first step is to stop avoiding dealing with the feelings**. You need to face them and allow yourself to feel what you are feeling and then **second, express your feelings in a respectful and loving manner** to yourself and others. Remember we can’t run away from ourselves indefinitely. If you are fearful or non trusting in your approach then it would be worthwhile to think about how come you are that way? Is it because of some experiences you had, or maybe your parent or family member acted this way and you learned this approach as a way of coping and relating? **Third, it is your choice to decide if you want to change your style**. If you want to do it, you will. As the Nike commercial said, “ Do It”. **The fourth step is to learn to listen as Jesus listens to you with his whole heart**. When we listen with all our attention our hearts will be able to feel the other and we can then react in a compassionate way. We will also be able to feel our own feelings and become less frightened and more assertive with others as well as ourselves. **The fifth step is to respond from a place of love rather than self-protection giving the other your understanding, time and love. And, sixth, think about compassion and decide if you want to learn to be compassionate, or more compassionate to others**. Each person will approach becoming compassionate or more so in a different way. The steps are not the order you may follow but the thoughts and actions you need to take are there for the taking and doing. In our troubled times this could be the greatest gift to give to each other in this Christmas season and throughout the coming year.

Dr. Pitta is a Clinical Psychologist and a Board Certified Family and Marital Psychologist practicing in Manhasset and is the chair of the Mental Health Ministry of St. Mary’s. She is also a professor of psychology at St. John’s University and a graduate of the Pastoral Formation Institute of Rockville Centre.
