The Sacrament is celebrated on the second Sunday of the month following the 10:30 AM Mass in the Chapel. If one is unable to come to Church, please call the Parish Office to arrange for a home visit for Anointing or reception of the Eucharist.

Do You Know?

This week's question: What does IHS stand for?

Answer to last week's question: Why isn't there a First Sunday in Ordinary Time in the liturgical calendar? The winter period of Ordinary Time begins after the Feast of the Baptism of The Lord which is the Sunday after The Epiphany of the Lord. This means that Ordinary Time begins on a Monday. The next Sunday is called the "Second Sunday in Ordinary Time," although it is more properly the Sunday of the second week in Ordinary Time. Thus, there is no actual "First Sunday in Ordinary Time," but there is a first week of Ordinary Time.

The Grandparents of Jesus - Part II



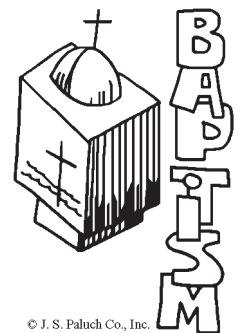

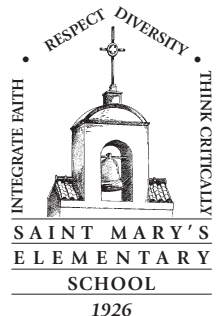
