### **The Birthday of the Church**

I remember from my youngest days hearing Pentecost being called the "birthday of the Church". It was around the Jewish feast of Pentecost (the Feast of Weeks – seven weeks after Passover) and shortly after Jesus' Ascension that the Spirit with a blast of wind and tongues of fire came upon the apostles in the Upper Room.

Before the coming of the Spirit they were gathered full of worry and yet prayerful. They were fearful and anxious because Jesus had left them and they didn't know what would happen to them now that he was gone. They were worried that they might be arrested and killed as he was. They were prayerful because Jesus taught them to pray in times of trouble and because Mary, who was such a model of trust in God, was with them.

The Spirit came and they were transformed into men of enthusiasm and courage. They left the Upper Room and went into the streets of Jerusalem sharing faith and hope in Jesus to all who would listen. The Acts of the Apostles tells us that many became believers that day.

The Spirit is still alive in the Church today. We can never forget or doubt that. The Spirit is with us guiding and pushing and pulling us in the direction that God wants us to go.

The challenge we have is to keep ourselves open to the Spirit's guiding hand.

The Spirit is always calling us as individuals and as a Church to live as Christ calls us and to give witness to Christ by proclaiming His teachings and values.

It is the Spirit that gives the Church its life!

### **Employee's Grandson with Leukemia**

## **Statement on Opposing Same-Sex Marriage**

In April, Governor David Paterson announced his support of same-sex marriage legislation. At that time the New York State Catholic Conference (NYSCC) called on the legislature to defeat this proposal, for which there is no compelling state interest and which will weaken rather than strengthen the institution of marriage.

Quoting from the 2008 statement of the New York State Bishops, the statement reaffirmed that "marriage always has been, is now and always will be a union of one man and one woman in an enduring bond. This is consistent with natural law, and should be obvious to all, no matter what their religion, or even if they have no religion at all. Common sense and empirical evidence tell us that children's welfare is best served in most cases by their being reared in a stable home with their mother and father. Encouraging marriage between a man and a woman, therefore, serves the state's interests. On the other hand, there is no compelling state interest in granting legal recognition to same-sex relationships. The simple fact that two people have a committed relationship is not a reason for the state to confer upon it the status of marriage. Our Church teaches, and we affirm, that we must treat our homosexual sisters and brothers with dignity and love, as we would all God's children. Indeed, the Catechism of the Catholic Church warns that any form of prejudice and hatred - 'every sign of unjust discrimination' – against homosexual people should be avoided."

Following the vote of the Assembly this week in favor of this legislation, the NYSCC stated that "the vote in the state Assembly to redefine marriage is not surprising but it is nevertheless disappointing. Marriage is the fundamental building block of our society. The state has always had a compelling interest in recognizing marriage for reasons of elementary biology, as was recognized by Judge Robert Smith in the 2006 NYS Court of Appeals decision, *Hernandez v. Robles*. Marriage is not simply a mechanism with which to provide people with benefits. By creating same-sex 'marriages,' the state is endorsing the notion that procreation is completely disconnected from marriage and that a nontraditional family structure serves a child as well as a traditional one. We firmly believe that this is terribly misguided."

The Conference statement called on the state Senate "in the strongest terms to reject this radical social experiment and continue to recognize marriage for what it has always been and always will be - the union of one man and one woman."

Catholics can and should express their opposition to this legislation through the NYSCC. It is a color of fire and zeal and passion. Those terms can be used to describe the events of Pentecost and thereafter as the disciples went out to bring all the world to Christ.

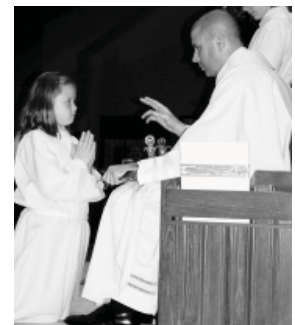
