A Letter from Bishop Murphy



World Day of Prayer for Vocations

“As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, ‘Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.’ At once they left their nets and followed him. He walked along from there and saw two other brothers, James and his brother John. They were in a boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets. He called them and immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him.” (Matthew 4:21-22)

Dear Friends in Christ:

In these two brief verses from Matthew’s gospel we witness the power of Jesus’ invitation. We are told that these fishermen left their nets “at once” and “immediately” followed the Lord. Presumably, they left what they knew. They walked away from what was familiar and safe to follow Jesus. Their decision to drop everything and follow Him must have created confusion and perhaps even anger among those closest to these fishermen. It is interesting to note that we never hear from Zebedee. He witnesses firsthand the invitation from this itinerant preacher to his own sons to follow Jesus. Seemingly without much hesitancy they step out of their old lives and embark on this bold adventure. Strangely enough Zebedee doesn’t appear to question their radical decision. There is no “where are you going” or “slow down and think this through”. There is no “what about your plans for the future” or “get back in the boat and stop this crazy discipleship talk”. I suspect the reason he remained silent and expressed no opposition was quite simply because he was there. He encountered the invitation. That is what happens when we meet Jesus. He speaks to the heart and leads us to trust in ways that many consider foolish. Zebedee must have known that Jesus had seized the hearts of his two sons and that for them, there would be no turning back.

The great writer and Christian apologist, G.K. Chesterton, defined an adventure as “something which by its very nature comes to us. It is a thing that chooses us, not a thing we choose”. James and John were chosen by Jesus to join Him in the greatest adventure of all - the adventure of discipleship.

In a particular way, I would ask you to pray for the Zebedees of today. Pray for the parents of young men and women who are being invited by the Lord to “step out of the boat”. Pray for those parents who are being asked by their sons and daughters to support their call to priesthood and religious life. Unlike Zebedee today’s parents don’t have the advantage of having been present when the invitation occurred. In these challenging times both within and beyond the Church, I suspect more trust, generosity and courage are required by parents than ever before. And so I ask you to pray for parents. Pray that the example of Zebedee inspires them to seek above all God’s will in the lives of their children.

This year the Church will celebrate World Day of Prayer for Vocations on May 15, 2011. May I ask you to reflect on its theme: Proposing Vocations in the Local Church. In his message the Holy Father reminds us that, “the ability to foster vocations is a hallmark of the vitality of a local Church”. I invite you to pray for the future of our local Church here on Long Island. Pray that our young people act with the boldness of James and John. Personally, I have reason to believe they will. This past March I had the opportunity to preside at the monthly Holy Hour for Vocations at our seminary in Huntington. I prayed with over four hundred teenagers before the Blessed Sacrament for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The next day I offered a retreat to nineteen men, ranging in age from fifteen to thirty-nine who believe that Jesus might be asking them to step out of the boat and follow Him to the priesthood. They were an impressive group and a reason for hope.

Pray for these men and also for all young people throughout our great Diocese. Pray also for their parents. Pray that they will see what Zebedee saw.

Do You Know?

This week's question: Why do we crown statues of the Blessed Mother with flowers in the month of May?

Answer to last week's question: Why was the date May 13th so important in the life of Blessed Pope John Paul II?

It was 30 years ago, on May 13, 1981, when an attempt was made on the life of the Pope while he rode in the Popemobile through St. Peter's Square. He was shot twice by a Turkish man who was mentally ill. It is also the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima and the anniversary of the date in 1917 when Our Lady first appeared to three children in Fatima, Portugal. The Pope believed that the shooting happened at the same hour that the apparition occurred. Pope John Paul was convinced that the intervention of the Blessed Mother saved his life. A year later, on May 13, 1982, Pope John Paul II went to Fatima and placed the bullet that almost killed him into the crown on the statue of Our Lady.

Mary Helps Caretakers “The Mother of All”

“Most holy and immaculate Virgin and our Mother Mary, you are our perpetual help, our refuge and our hope” (verse from a novena to Mary).

Many a middle-aged to older person has come to talk to me about caring for an elderly parent or spouse. A common frustration and concern is that they can't believe how their elderly parent or spouse is behaving. They are not cooperative, but rather suspicious and demanding. I tell them to not take their actions personally because the elderly person is compromised in their thoughts, actions and feelings. Many times they are frightened due to their health and aging, so they act in a very different way than you were used to when they were not ill. This is a difficult concept for the caretaker to understand because of their own personal desire to see the person they are caring for as they knew him or her in the past. The caregivers want to escape their personal sad feelings of loss which sometimes can be expressed in anger and depression.

There comes a time in all families when the care of the elderly becomes an overwhelming responsibility for the family system and its members (Pitta, 2003). Caretaking of each other is vital to survival. The usual scenario is a mid-life or elderly person, usually a daughter and sometimes a daughter-in-law, is called upon to assist an elderly parent. These groups of caretakers are part of the “sandwich generation” (Chisholm, 1999) nurturing family members in different generations at the same time. The average age of the caregiver of the elderly is 46 years old with a breakdown of middle age caregivers ranging in age from 35 to 64. The average age of older caregivers is 63 years old caring for someone 65 years and older. Another group of caretakers are elderly spouses in their 60's and 70's caring for their spouse who suffers

from Alzheimer's or other neurological illnesses; e.g., Parkinson's, and long term medical illnesses. The stress and strain upon the caregiver is overwhelming because of the many pressures, persons and situations that need nurturing.

Caretakers have their own medical and psychological history and needs. They are exposed to stresses that affect their cognitive functioning as well as medical and psychological health. Caretakers experience 23% higher levels of stress hormones and 15% lower levels of antibody responses when compared to non-caregivers. Caregivers experience higher levels of depression, poor health, physical dysregulation, psychiatric and medical issues and higher medical mortality than non-caregivers (Vitaliano, 2009). How caretakers manage and care for themselves can become a source of tremendous stress, pain, frustration and sadness. The question is, “How can you take care of the caretaker?”

An answer can be found by forming a relationship with Mary. Pray to Mary (see the prayer at the end of the article). You can start by praying to Mary to give you the strength and fortitude you need to get through this difficult time of life. You can start your own personal novena. May is the month to honor Mary. She takes care of all no matter what your age or need. She is the mother of all of us. If you have a relationship with Mary, you are never alone in your caretaking responsibilities. She will accompany you as you journey through your many duties and chores. How can you develop a relationship with Mary? Another suggestion is to find a support group that will focus on helping the caregivers through Mary. There is a Mothers Group for Mary. Is there someone in the parish who wants to start a Caregiver's Group for Mary? Please call the Office of Social Ministry at 365-

2075 if you are interested. In community, problems are solved with greater ease than alone. Another possible resource is Inisfada (621-8300) which offers programs for caregivers.

Prayer to Our Lady of Perpetual Help

Mother of Perpetual Help, you have been blessed and favored by God. You became not only the Mother of the Redeemer but the Mother of the redeemed as well. We come to you today as your loving children. Watch over us and take care of us. As you held the child Jesus in your loving arms, so take us in your arms. Be a mother ready at every moment to help us. For God who is mighty has done great things for you and His mercy is from age to age on those who love Him. Our greatest fear is that in time of temptation, we may fail to call out to you and become lost children. Intercede for us, dear Mother, in obtaining pardon for our sins, love for Jesus, final perseverance, and the grace always to call upon you, Mother of Perpetual Help (from the Novena to Our Lady of Perpetual Help).

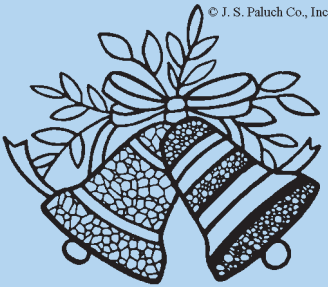
