The Sacrament is celebrated on the second Sunday of the month following the 10:30 AM Mass in the Chapel. If one is unable to come to Church, please call the Parish Office to arrange for a home visit for Anointing or reception of the Eucharist.

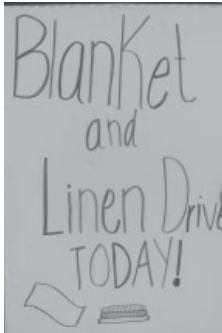

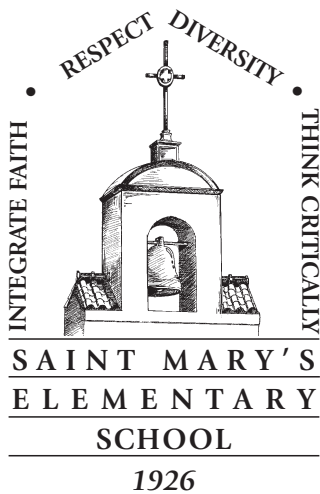


Veterans Day

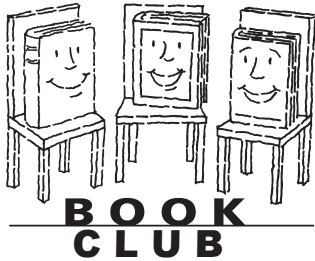
Adult Faith Formation

Do You Know?

This week's question: Why has the name of religious instruction in the parish changed over time? It was Called CCD when I was young, then Religious Education and now Faith Formation.

Answer to last week's question: What does the word *catechesis* mean? The word *catechesis* comes from the Greek word *katēkhēsis*, which means to “echo” or to teach by word of mouth. In the early Church, those preparing to become Christians were taught through sermons given by bishops and other leaders of the community who were known as catechists. Those preparing for baptism came to be called catechumens, ones who are receiving instruction in the faith. Today catechesis has become synonymous with teaching religious education to children, but it goes beyond that to passing on the faith tradition to all – children, adults, and those preparing to become Christians.

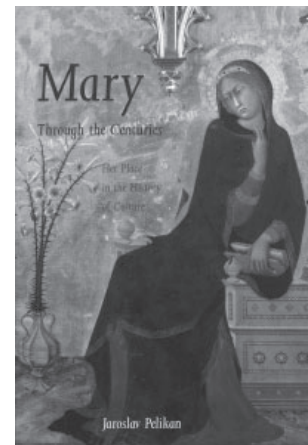

***The Eucharistic Prayer - Part I:
Introduction to the Eucharistic Prayers***

We now arrive at the high point of the Mass, the great prayer of thanksgiving. While some people might focus solely on the words of institution, what we commonly call the Consecration, as the highlight, it is important to note that the entire Eucharistic Prayer is the action of Christ, who is not only made present, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity, but whose entire Paschal Mystery is “*once again enacted and offered to the Father by Christ himself in the person of the priest, and by all present*” (USCCB Missal Formation Materials, 2010). This article gives a general overview of the Eucharistic Prayers.

Those of us who are baby boomer age or older may remember when there was only one Eucharistic Prayer at Mass known as the Roman Canon. This prayer has been part of the Mass since at least the 6th Century with few changes since then. In the ancient Church, the presider would follow a format for the Eucharistic Prayer, also called an *anaphora*. *Anaphora* is a Greek term that means “carrying back,” or “carrying up.” It means “offering” in liturgical terms. In the first few centuries there was a loose structure for this prayer, but the presider would pray it in his own words. There are no surviving texts from this time period and the earliest description of a Eucharistic liturgy comes from Justin Martyr in the second century. The Roman Canon, once it was established, was, for the most part, the only Eucharistic Prayer used in the Latin Rite Church up until Vatican II. Yet, there were many other rites celebrated within the Eastern and parts of the Western Church. Today, even within the Roman Catholic Church, there are several different rites that utilize their own prayers. Most recently, with the Motu Proprio, *Summorum Pontificum*, which allowed for unrestricted use of the 1962 Missal, we now have two different forms of the same Latin Rite Eucharistic liturgy being celebrated.

Following Vatican II, the entire Missal was revised, including the Roman Canon, and twelve other Eucharistic Prayers were added to the Missal. You may be most familiar with the ones that are printed in the missalette. Eucharistic Prayer I, the Roman Canon, is the longest with its explicit focus on sacrifice and the remembrance by name of the early saints and martyrs. Eucharistic Prayer II, based on a third or fourth century text, is the shortest and most often used. Eucharistic Prayer III was composed following Vatican II and has many beautiful elements not found in the other prayers. Eucharistic Prayer IV is based on an ancient anaphora and has its own preface, which must be used. The other Eucharistic Prayers have variable prefaces. I personally like Eucharistic Prayer IV because it gives a wonderful summary of the history of salvation. The other nine prayers are used less often. There are two Eucharistic Prayers for Masses of Reconciliation. These prayers have nothing to do with the Sacrament of Reconciliation but may be used at times when the focus of the readings, feast, season or situation calls for the theme of reconciliation with God, the Church, with others, or on conversion. There are three Eucharistic Prayers for Masses with Children. These prayers may be used only when the assembly consists mostly of children with few adults present, such as at a school Mass. These prayers are simpler and call for greater participation of the children. The remaining Eucharistic Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions are used less often and are included in a separate book as an appendix to the Roman Missal.

In the revised English translation, we will see dramatic revisions to these texts. This is to reflect fidelity to the Latin text, to correct some doctrinal confusion that occurs with the current translation, and to create a sense of a unique liturgical language that is less quotidian and more sacred.

The basic format of the Eucharistic Prayer, with a few differences in the Roman Canon, is:

Dialogue	Memorial Acclamation – the Mystery of Faith
Preface	Anamnesis – remembering the Paschal Mystery
Sanctus (Holy Holy)	Offering – of the sacrifice to the Father
Epiclesis or invocation of the Holy Spirit upon the offerings	Intercessions – for the Church and the living and dead
Institution Narrative – Consecration	Second epiclesis upon those assembled
	Doxology and Great Amen

When you come to Mass this week, pay close attention to the words of the Eucharistic Prayer. Can you identify the different parts listed above?

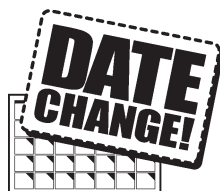
St. Mary's High School Student Is Collecting Children's DVD's and CD's and Arts & Crafts Supplies

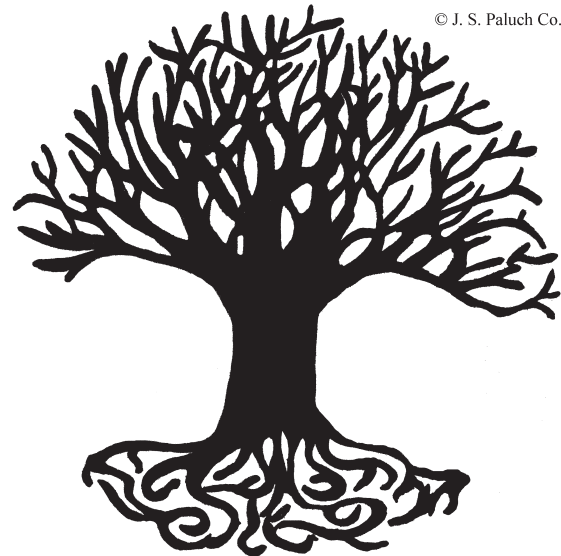

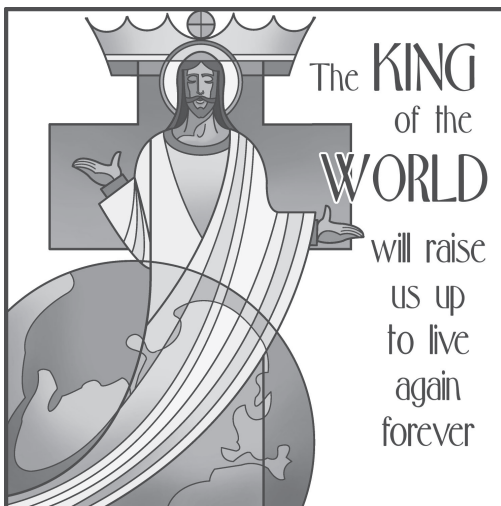
